FEW hosted 95 Exhibitors as they showcased their products and services in 2010, and an even greater number is expected in 2011.


FEW is planning to look at its history through the eyes of its Past Presidents as we gather in this historical city.



Laura Liswood Secretary General, Council of Women World Leaders Senior Advisor, Goldman Sachs

A nationally recognized speaker, author, and advisor, Laura Liswood has contributed to leadership and diversity in the women's community for many years. Former commissioner of the City of

Seattle Women's Commission, Liswood was the owner/publisher of Seattle Woman. In 2000, the Secretary of Defense appointed her to a three-year term of the Defense Advisory Committee on Women in the Services (DACOWITS). After the events of September 11, 2001, Liswood became a reserve police officer in Washington, D.C. and is now a sergeant.

Her latest book, *The Loudest Duck (Wiley and Sons)*, is a business guide that uses parables and anecdotes to examine the challenges to traditional workplace diversity efforts and provides innovative strategies to create truly effective workplaces for all.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

1992-1996 — Served as director of the Women's Leadership Project identifying global leadership contributions by women heads of state, 15 of whom she interviewed, culminating in her book and video documentary, Women World Leaders (1996 and 2007, Harper Collins).

1996 — Co-founded the Council of Women World Leaders, composed of women presidents, prime ministers, and heads of government, where she serves as Secretary General.

1997 — Co-founded The White House Project which was inspired by her work with women global leaders and is dedicated to electing a woman President in the United States.

2001 — Named Managing Director, Global Leadership and Diversity for Goldman Sachs working on issues of globalization and workforce diversity. She now serves as a Senior Advisor to the firm.

Degrees held — She holds a B.A. from California State University, San Diego and an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School. She holds a J.D. degree from the University of California, Davis, School of Law, and is admitted to practice law in California and Massachusetts.

Books — She is also the author of a book on service quality, *Serving Them Right* (Harper Business).
